This is a solid example that with a little support from the community, many young lives can be given a new direction. Sonali's education had been sponsored by a generous soul and Saksham is also proud to have been associated with this young lady, Sonali.



Priyanka Dey, who also hails from a migrant family from West Bengal, was fortunate to have found a well-wisher and had completed her studies at the Army Public School, Noida. She had been involved with Saksham as a Teacher.Priyanka too has now finished school and is employed. She too is now pursuing her graduation at IGNOU. We wish her all the very best.

Another success story is that of Sonam Khasu, who hails from Nepal. Sonam had first come to Saksham to enroll her little son Basant. Then she decided to become a student herself and started learning from scratch, as she had never gone to school. Her childhood had been spent tending to the cattle and fetching water from a distance and doing the household chores while her parents worked in the fields. And then she got married and came to Delhi. Her husband, who works as a chef, was initially skeptical of her new interest, but as she went along undeterred, his support too came her way. Meanwhile she had another child and would come with the baby to study as well as to assist with the smaller children.



Last year, she enrolled herself in the Government school in the 8<sup>th</sup> standard and passed the exam. Now she is preparing for her tenth standard exams from the National Open School. We wish Sonam all success in her endeavors.

A really positive thing that has been happening in the past few months, are the visits of volunteers from IBM, who have been taking out time from their very busy schedules to take classes for the children at Saksham.



We salute their commitment and hope this will continue because the inputs are really helpful for the children. We are also grateful to the Organization "I Volunteer", through whom this tie-up happened.

A special thanks to Shri Ramesh Shamdasani , whose Foundation, the Saibaba Trust, has donated a handsome amount of Rs. I Lakh/ towards the running expenses of the school.



Shri Ramesh had also recently visited the school and expressed his appreciation. He has made certain suggestions towards making Saksham a self-sustaining effort and we are earnestly exploring all ways towards this goal. We will be really glad to receive your views/suggestions in this regard. Needless to say that the financial aspect of such a programme is a major determiner of its continuity. We are at present incurring an expenditure of Rs.35000-40000 towards the rent, payment of salaries, nutritional supplements and other incidental expenses. The student strength at present is over 500.

The exams had been postponed last year indefinitely and unfortunately, the kids who had prepared for the same could not receive their hall tickets due to some administrative error and could not therefore appear for the exam when it was finally held in July. The exam for the next academic year is slotted to be held in February.

We assure you again that all contributions are utilized only for the running of the school and for the benefit of the children.
